## **ARPA Update**

- All 63 projects have launched
- As of September 30th approximately \$130M of the \$530M has been spent
  - We have another \$131.6M encumbered or allocated (includes anticipated expenditures for rate increases)
- Quarterly CMS report submitted on Monday; JBC quarterly report is due November 1st
  - Reports will be posted on the website and are a great reference for project specific updates



## **Open ARPA HCBS RFAs**

6.06 "Dollars to Digitize" Provider Digital Transformation and Electronic Health Record (EHR) Upgrades Grant Program

- Funding may be used to make investments in upgrading or implementing electronic health record systems to be able to better coordinate care, access real-time information through health information exchanges, and the purchase of tools necessary for the delivery of virtual services.
- Who is Eligible: Medicaid-enrolled home and community-based services (HCBS) providers and Medicaid-enrolled behavioral health providers
- Max Award: \$500,000

#### 1.05 Training Fund - Provider Grant

- Provide more training opportunities and incentives for workers to gain higher-level skills that would promote greater retention within the HCBS workforce
- Who is Eligible: Currently enrolled Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) waiver providers; or training vendor/provider that develops/delivers training/specialization for the HCBS workforce.
- *Max Award*: \$100,000



## **Open ARPA HCBS RFAs**

#### 2.01 Behavioral Health Transition Community Grants

- The project provides short-term grant funding for behavioral health crisis and transition services between residential/inpatient and outpatient care. Awards will vary, and grants must:
  - Support Medicaid members moving from an institutional setting or correctional facility to the community
  - > Focus on increasing capacity for community-based care
  - Not be used to fund existing resources or services that could be billed through Medicaid or other funding sources.
- Who is Eligible: Adult or Child Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility, Qualified Residential Treatment Providers, Hospitals, Crisis Stabilization Units, Acute Treatment Units, Detox and Residential Substance Use Licensed ASAM Providers and MAT providers, or a Community Behavioral Health Agency serving adult and/or child and adolescent populations.
- *Max Award*: \$2,500,000

# Budget & Legislative Session

## Case Management RFP

<u>Purpose:</u> The purpose of the Request for Proposal (RFP) is to solicit proposals from interested parties who have experience providing case management services to Medicaid members and individuals enrolled in State General Fund programs.

- This is an open competitive process that will result in the Department selecting offeror's "whose proposal is determined in writing to be the most advantageous to the state..." (C.R.S. §24-103-203(7))
- Likewise, this competitive process encourages proposals from all agency types and will result in the Department conducting a comprehensive, thorough, complete and impartial evaluation of each proposal received.



## On Hold: Coaching & TA

The Department has made the decision to suspend all HMA Capacity Building one-onone coaching and technical assistance (TA). This means we are:

- Stopping all individual communications until further notice (until after the RFP response period has closed)
- Adapting the current small Learning Collaborative cohort groups to public webinars
- Suspending any technical assistance, including work being implemented by third parties through MOUs and subcontracts

This decision is applicable to <u>ALL</u> CMAs and all individualized activities - there is no exception for CMAs who are not participating in the RFP.

No TA activities will be funded through this project between October 15, 2022, and the RFP Proposal Submission Deadline which is anticipated to be March 1, 2023.
