



Scott Bartlett is the Olmstead Liaison for the Colorado Department of Disability Opportunity (CDOO), where he works to advance community integration and ensure people with disabilities have meaningful opportunities to live, work, and participate in the communities of their choice. In this role, he collaborates with state agencies, community organizations, advocates, and individuals with lived experience to support Colorado's Olmstead planning efforts and promote compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Scott brings more than two decades of experience in disability advocacy, independent living, and long-term services and supports. Prior to joining CDOO, he served as an Advocacy Specialist at The Independence Center, a Center for Independent Living (CIL), where he supported individuals with disabilities in exercising their rights, navigating complex systems, and achieving greater independence in their communities. Before his work in independent living, Scott spent approximately 15 years as a Long-Term Care Ombudsman, advocating for residents of nursing homes and assisted living facilities and helping protect their rights, dignity, and quality of life.

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
