Dear Senator Bennet,

We write to ask that you support Home and Community-Based Services for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities by stressing to Senator Schumer the need for dedicated HCBS-specific funding. This must be a top priority!

Alliance is a statewide, non-profit association of Community Centered Boards and service agencies serving Coloradans with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Our 67 members operate in every Colorado county and serve tens of thousands of Colorado citizens and their families.

Specifically, we ask you to support the provisions outlined in Section 30103 of the HEROES Act, including a targeted HCBS FMAP increase. A global FMAP increase does not trickle down to our sector and is generally applied to hospitals, nursing homes, and overall state budget needs. Yet these funds are necessary to sustain the workforce that supports people with disabilities, the service providers who employ them, and the people who rely on our services to live safely in their homes and communities. Without the continuity of these services, millions of people with disabilities will be at risk of service disruption, lack of support to remain in their homes, and an increased risk for institutionalization.

The impact of COVID-19 on our members and the people they support has already been significant. We have providers experiencing substantial losses in revenue and increased costs due to COVID-19 specific, unanticipated expenses. These expenses include testing for staff, cleaning supplies, PPE, hazard pay, increased overtime, and more. IDD providers run on extremely slim margins to begin with, and the weight of this pandemic has stretched resources to the breaking point, especially since recent CMS guidance limited states' ability to provide retainer payments. In a recent national industry poll, 10.6 per cent of organizations who had to close at least one line of service due to the pandemic report that they will not reopen that program. This creates access issues for people with disabilities and further weakens their safety net.

We need your help to tell Senator Schumer that dedicated HCBS-specific funding is your top priority.
