- ✓ 292 DD waiver enrollments for emergencies/transitions
- ✓ 129 new DD waiver enrollments
- \$1 per hour Base Wage increases
 for Direct Support Professionals
- Medicaid common policy rate of at least 2%
- ✓ Pediatric Behavioral Therapy rate increases at original benchmark
- \$27 million Financial relief for CMAs due to "perfect storm"
- Early Intervention caseload growth and rate increases

- ✓ Expanded access to Community
 Access Team housing vouchers
- Regional Center transition rate increase
- ✓ IDD Bills
 - ✓ Supported: 12 bills
 - ✓ Monitored 11 bills
 - ✓ Reviewed 36 bills
 - ✓ Amended 3 bills
- In DC: Unanimously PASSED the Direct Support Professional Act in the US Senate and PASSED the US House committee.
